Option 1

Drawing a map

Medium: Pencil, pen, pencil crayons or markers

Where do the roads go and where do they meet?

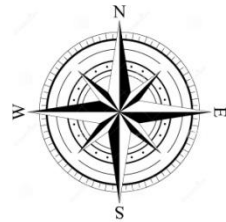
For this drawing assignment you are to design a map of your choice. It can be realistic or make believe; it can be a map of your favourite video game, of your neighbourhood, or a map of your favourite city with directions to your favourite restaurant!

You may use one of the following mapping techniques or come up with your own style; you **must** incorporate a legend for your map.

If you would like to create a map on a separate sheet other than your sketchbook for a larger scale you may (ex. poster board). Think about the surface treatment of the paper, you may incorporate the tea bag method or burnt paper edges.

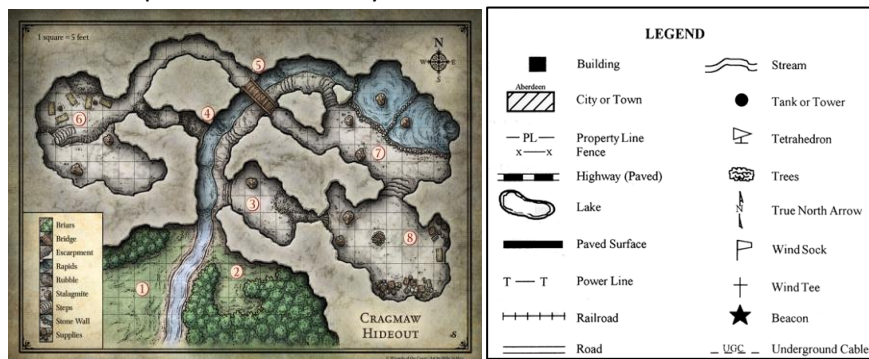
Map styles:

What is a legend?

A map legend is a visual explanation of the symbols used on the map. It typically includes a sample of each symbol (point, line, or area), and a short description of what the symbol means.



Option 2

Detailed close-up drawing

Medium: Pencil, charcoal

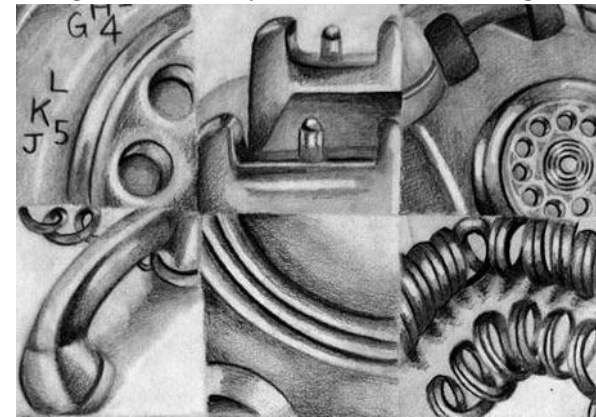
Choose one object and draw it 6 different times, in 6 different angles.

It is important to incorporate the objects` details.

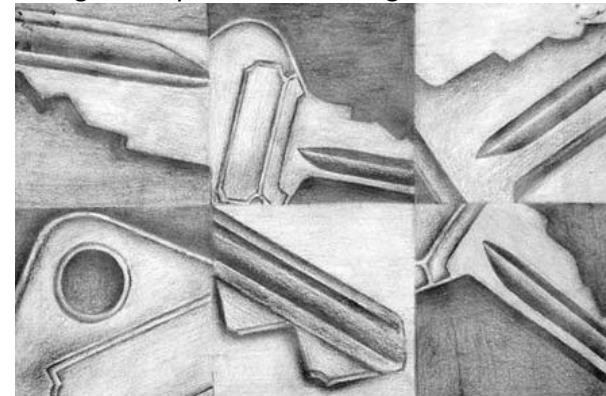
Be sure to use shadows, values (lightness/darkness), texture (surface of the object-smooth, rough, etc.), form (3D) and a background.

**Give your drawing a title

Option 3

Creating a reproduction
