Getty Museum Re-Creation Challenge

Reproduce your favourite art work using things you find around the house! Focus: Composition, reviewing the elements of art and principles of design

Motivation:

Studying the art work of other artists can help you understand how they have used different tools (the elements of art) and compositional strategies (the principles of design) to create dynamic and visually interesting works of art.

This is a good activity to help review the elements and principles and will help when it comes time to writing critiques in class.

Activity:

Step 1:

Select any art work you like from the collection at the Getty Museum or other museum of your choice. There is a list of great museums at the end of this document if you are unsure of where to look. I suggest choosing a piece with multiple elements so that you can be more creative with your own version.

Step 2:

Recreate the art work using things you have at home!

This is an exercise in looking closely. Find similarities between what you see in the art work and what you have available at home, and then apply the same strategies as the artist to re-create your own version of their composition.

Once complete, take a photo of your recreation and put it side by side with the original. Be sure to clearly, and properly identify the source image with the title, year, and artist's name!!
